

**CUT BANK CITY COUNCIL
JUNE 5, 2017
6:30 P.M. – CITY HALL**

CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Council President Tim Curtiss called the meeting of the Cut Bank City Council to order at 6:30 PM, Monday, June 5, 2017. The following Council members answered roll call: Councilpersons Donovan Grubb and Tyson Michaels. Also present were City Clerk-Treasurer Linda Burley, City Superintendent Jim Suta, City Attorney Robert Smith. All present stood and recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

ABSENT: Councilperson Tim Kipp.

VISITORS: None.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Allen Racine voiced his concerns about the Suboxone Clinic. He lives near the clinic and sees the Clinic's clients in the alley and believes they are doing drugs. He found one of its clients in his house one day when he returned home and is very concerned about the neighborhood. He thanked everyone for all they do for the City and requested that the Police keep an extra watch on the area.

CLAIMS: Councilperson Michaels moved to approve the claims through May 30, 2017 for \$157,799.30. Councilperson Grubb seconded the motion and the motion carried with a 3-0 vote.

ADDITIONAL ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION: Councilperson Curtiss would like to see some speed signs near the Anna Jeffries school and suggested it be included in the street budget.

CONSENT AGENDA:

Councilperson Grubb moved to approve the City Council Minutes from May 15, 2017, Payroll for June 1, 2017 for \$74,940.50, and the April Financials for \$6,058.225.11. Councilperson Michaels seconded the motion. Motion passed 3-0.

Councilperson Curtiss moved to approve the City Council Minutes from May 18, 2017, and the Payroll from May 18, 2017 in the amount of \$73,248.76. Councilperson Michaels seconded the motion that passed unanimously.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

City Superintendent reported that water usage is increasing with the warmer weather. All streets have been swept at least once and they are patching holes and repairing dig areas. The wastewater treatment plant is well underway. Spring cleanup went well, but they are still seeing items left in the alleys. Work is being done on the River Park. Several items were declared as surplus in his report. **Councilperson Curtiss moved to approve the Superintendent's report. Councilperson Michaels seconded the motion. It passed 3-0.**

OLD BUSINESS:

None.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chris Robinson, representing the Lion's Club, requested permission to paint the railings at Central Park. This would be a part of their Centennial Project. They will furnish the painting supplies and do the work, but requested the City buy the paint. **Councilperson Grubb moved to approve the painting of the railings at Central Park by the Lion's Club with the City paying for the paint. Councilperson Michaels seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.**

Tom Shock had previously requested that the block of Central Avenue, between Main Street and Railroad, be closed for the Lewis & Clark Festival Street Dance on Friday, July 28, 2017. **Councilperson Curtiss moved to approve the street closure of Central Avenue, between Main Street and Railroad, the night of July 28, 2017. Councilperson Grubb seconded the motion that carried 3-0.**

Councilperson Grubb moved to approve Wastewater Bond Resolution 17-5. Councilperson Michaels seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0

Councilperson Grubb moved to approve the Agreement between Owners and Contractors for the Pavilion Cover. Councilperson Michaels seconded the motion. The motion passed 3-0.

Councilperson Grubb moved to approve the Treasure State Endowment Program Draw #1 for \$187,896.80. Councilperson Curtiss seconded the motion and motion passed unanimously.

Councilperson Michaels made a motion to approve the Livescan Contract with the Glacier County Sheriff's Department. Councilperson Grubb seconded the motion. The motion was approved 3-0.

Councilperson Grubb moved to approve Resolution 17-6, the Drug and Alcohol Policy, as amended. Councilperson Curtiss seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Councilperson Grubb moved to approve the City Policy Handbook, as amended. Councilperson Michaels seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.
