by \$50,000 for additional concrete work. Superintendent Suta is looking at alternatives now as

he believes this is too much. The area where residents can drop off large metal items was

discussed. There will be signage installed and then the City will advertise the spot. **Councilperson** 

Fey moved to accept the City Superintendent's report and Councilperson Curtiss seconded

the motion. Motion carried 3-0.

City Attorney Smith reported that he has been busy and has not completed the list of things

that the Mayor requested of him. Councilperson Curtiss moved to accept the City Attorney's

report and Councilperson Vermulm seconded the motion. Motion carried 3-0.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Police Chief Schultz reported that there were another five graduates from

Drug Court last week. He sits on the Court and feels it is a very worthwhile program.

Mayor Winchell reported that the COPSS had not met last week but will meet this Wednesday.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Vernon Thomas asked if anything can be done if someone calls in a drunk

individual walking the streets, causing danger to himself and others. The State made it illegal

to charge someone with public intoxication but when these calls are received, our officers will

try to bring the individual to some place safe.
